## A New Habit

If you were looking for "Where did my \$\$ Go? (Part 2) this month, well I'm sorry but that topic has been put off until December. This month I felt the need to write about a topic that I've struggled with as a father and as your spiritual leader.

During a recent Sunday morning Bible study we discussed the topic of family devotions. One of the areas that we discussed was the obstacles that keep us from having these devotional times. The list that the class came up with included: time, participation, various age levels, resources, and it's never been our habit.

I later shared this discussion with our Board of Elders and we all agreed that this is an area where we need to provide help for our members.

That help is coming in the form of a short weekly devotion created weekly by Concordia Seminary. It is titled "Table Talk" and it consists of four short sections: Prepare, Read, Reflect, Pray. These devotions are based on one of the readings from Sunday and can be used at any time during the week. They only take about 10 minutes depending on the amount of time taken to reflect and they allow all family members to participate except for the very young. I will take a little time to share how to use them each Sunday this month and after the service we will hand out a copy or two to each family. Each following Sunday we will briefly discuss the devotion from the previous week during the announcement time.

My family is like many of yours in that devotional time has not always been a part of our weekly routine. It is my desire that we encourage one another throughout this month as we weekly discuss these devotions and build toward creating a new habit in our homes.

If your family already has a set routine and uses other resources that's great, continue what you're doing! With God's blessings, many of our families by the end of the month will have joined you in taking time each week to be in God's Word.

### Non-Traditional Worship Service Seeking Musicians

St. Paul's Lutheran Church will be offering an alternate worship service in place of our standard service on the second Sunday of each month starting in November. With approval of the Board of Elders, the Worship Committee is developing the special service as *non-traditional* in order to provide optional service styles. This action is for our members requests, as well as new requirements for placing seminarians at local churches.

The liturgy is from Creative Worship, published by CPH, the LCMS publishing house. This has been used occasionally throughout the years at St. Paul's. Worship music will be expanded to include contemporary songs with modern instrument accompaniment for congregation singing. Ideally live music is desired, but until additional musicians are recruited, use of the piano, electric piano, as well as DVD music displayed via projector will be used. Eventually the use of guitars and drums, as well as other instruments will be used.

So, if you play any instrument suitable for worship, traditional or non-traditional, and willing to share your talents, please notify any of the Worship Committee.
